DIYers can also take their used motor oil and filters to one of the County's Household Hazardous and Electronic Waste (HHW/E-Waste) free weekend collection events for convenient recycling.

According to the Environmental Protection Agency Used Oil Management Program, used motor oil is insoluble, persistent and can contain toxic chemicals and heavy metals. It's slow to degrade. It sticks to everything from beach sand to bird feathers. Used oil is a major source of oil contamination of waterways and can result in the pollution of drinking water sources.
