## REQUEST TO SIGN - ASSEMBLY BILL 2440 (IRWIN) AS ENROLLED ON SEPTEMBER 2, 2022 - RESPONSIBLE BATTERY RECYCLING ACT OF 2022

The Los Angeles County Solid Waste Management Committee/Integrated Waste Management Task Force (Task Force) is pleased to **support** Assembly Bill 2240 (AB 2240), as enrolled on September 2, 2022.

The proposed legislation, if enacted, among other things, would enact the Responsible Battery Recycling Act of 2022 (ACT), requiring producers of covered batteries, as defined, to either individually or through the creation of one or more stewardship organizations, establish a stewardship program for the free and convenient collection, transportation, and recycling of covered batteries. The bill would require a program operator to develop and submit a stewardship plan with standards and elements required to be contained in a stewardship plan for covered batteries to the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) and the Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) for review and approval. The bill also requires CalRecycle in consultation with DTSC to adopt regulations to implement the ACT with an effective date of no earlier than April 1, 2025. Additionally, the proposed legislation would provide for enforcement of the ACT, including authorizing CalRecycle to impose an administrative civil penalty on a stewardship organization, producer, manufacturer, distributor, retailer, importer, recycler, or collection site in violation of the ACT. The amount of the civil penalty is not to exceed \$10,000 per day, unless the violation is intentional, knowing, or reckless, then in that case not to exceed \$50,000 per day.

The Task Force is in support of this measure as it would create a proper and safe collection program for batteries which are often discarded in curbside solid waste containers or recyclable bins posing battery fire threats to solid waste collection personnel, transportation vehicles, and recycling facilities.

Pursuant to Chapter 3.67 of the Los Angeles County Code and the California Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989 (Assembly Bill 939), the Task Force is responsible for coordinating the development of all major solid waste planning documents prepared for the County of Los Angeles and the 88 cities in Los Angeles County with a combined population in excess of ten million. Consistent with these responsibilities and to ensure a coordinated and cost-effective and environmentally sound solid waste management system in Los Angeles County, the Task Force also addresses issues impacting the system on a countywide basis. The Task Force membership includes representatives of the League of California Cities-Los Angeles County Division, County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors, City of Los Angeles, waste management industry, environmental groups, the public, and a number of other governmental agencies.
