**PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CITY OF POMONA
NONDISPOSAL FACILITY ELEMENT**

On May 11, 2010, the City of Pomona requested the Los Angeles County Solid Waste Management Committee/Integrated Waste Management Task Force (Task Force) to review and comment on the proposed amendment to the City of Pomona's Nondisposal Facility Element to include the proposed Pomona Valley Transfer Station (copy enclosed). The facility will be located at 1371 East 9th Street, Pomona, California 91766.

The facility will operate as a Transfer Station and will accept mixed residential waste, commercial waste, wood/green waste, construction demolition and inert debris, sort them at the tipping floor and load them for transportation to processing plants. The facility will cover 10.5 acres, which will include a tipping area, load-out area, sub-grade transfer tunnel, office/employee area, maintenance area, parking area, and a scale house. The facility will be designed to process up to 1,500 tons per day with an estimated diversion rate up to five percent.

On July 15, 2010, pursuant to the requirements of Sections 40950, 41734, and 50001 of the Public Resources Code and Section 18761 of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations, the Task Force, at a publicly noticed meeting, considered the request. The Task Force considered the facility's operations with respect to meeting the solid waste management needs of jurisdictions in Los Angeles County as well as the waste reduction mandates identified in the California Integrated Waste Management Act of 1989 (AB 939, as amended).

The Task Force concurs with the proposed amendment to the City's Nondisposal Facility Element subject to the following requirement:

- The Task Force requires the facility owner/operator to submit monthly reports on a quarterly basis (within 30 days of the end of the quarter) to Public Works, Environmental Programs Division (staff to the Task Force). The reports (located at www.solidwasteredrs.org) should contain the types and quantity of waste, by weight, received for processing, recycling, and disposal at offsite facilities. Enclosed is a sample form that can be used to comply with the requested information.


Dear Mr. Wu Tan:
