

Project Scope:

The primary objective of this project is to improve the roadway on Susana Road from Artesia Boulevard to the 710 Freeway interchange and Via Mondo from Susana Road to the west cul-de-sac. The project includes small areas of pavement and concrete work in the Cities of Long Beach and Compton.

- o Pavement reconstruction.
- o Reconstruction of curb and gutter, sidewalk, driveways, and curb ramps.
- Modification of traffic signals.
- o Lane conversion to accommodate bike lanes.

Project development began in mid-2013. Public Works met several times with representatives of the Longwood Neighborhood Association who have voiced concerns regarding the failure of the pavement on Susana Road and its contribution to traffic noise.

Project Benefits:

The project improves driver rideability and increases the level of comfort for motorists and nearby residents by providing a smooth-riding pavement. The addition of bike lanes will improve access for bicyclists to schools and the Rancho Dominguez Industrial Center and connect to existing bike lanes on Artesia Boulevard and Victoria Street.
