Capital Projects in the District

The District is continually working to improve the condition of the water distribution system to ensure a reliable water supply for its customers. In addition to routine maintenance and operation of the system, the following projects are currently in progress for the District.

Antelope Valley Disinfection Conversion

The District is in the process of changing the disinfection process at many of its groundwater facilities in the Antelope Valley from the use of chlorine to chloramines. This conversion is necessary to match the disinfection method that will be used by the Antelope Valley-East Kern Water Agency (AVEK) beginning late 2006. AVEK is converting its treatment facilities to use chloramines for disinfection so that its water will meet new State and Federal water quality requirements. The District purchases water from AVEK and blends it with groundwater from wells to serve our customers. Both of these sources of water must be disinfected in the same manner to avoid potential water quality problems from blending. This project is currently being designed and construction is tentatively scheduled to be completed by October 2006. Additional information on chloramines will be provided to you prior to the change.

Water System Security Upgrade

A Vulnerability Assessment Study completed in March 2003 for the District recommended the installation of additional security measures at critical facilities throughout the District. In response, the District is currently in the process of implementing the security measures that were recommended in the Study. The purpose of this project is to reduce the risk of possible terrorist attacks to critical facilities within the water distribution system. To protect the water distribution system, security devices such as access control systems that restrict access to authorized personnel, electronic monitoring devices such as security cameras, digital video recording equipment, and intrusion detection systems such as motion sensors will be installed at critical facilities throughout the District. Construction is scheduled to be completed by late 2006.

- 1 This area displays any important messages we have for our customers.
- 2 This area displays the total amount of water used during the billing cycle.
- This area displays the total cost of water used in the normal use tier.
- This area displays the total cost of water used in the conservation use tier.
- This area displays the total cost of water used in the excessive use tier.
- 6 These three rows display the total amount of water used in each of the three tiers.
- These three rows display the cost per hundred cubic feet of water used in each of the three tiers. The rates will be displayed if water was used in the associated tiers.
