I want to take a moment to recognize and commend the efforts of MH Fuels. They have been doing an excellent job at meeting the extreme demand for Jet-A fuel, ensuring that aerial tankers have the resources in combating the fires from the air. I urge patience as they prioritize the refueling needs at the Fox Air Tanker Base ramp.

As the wildfires continue to burn in the surrounding areas, we kindly ask everyone to exercise heightened safety and caution when operating around our ramp and apron areas. This ongoing activity will likely persist as the fires remain active.

Southern California's seasonal high wind events, such as, the Santa Anas can significantly impact operations. It is essential to properly secure aircraft, equipment, and any loose items around the airport.

Please also be reminded to adhere to the posted speed limit of 10 mph on the ramp and apron areas with a reduced speed limit of 5 mph within 50 feet of any aircraft. This is vital for maintaining safety in high traffic zones, particularly during heightened operational activity. Unsafe or otherwise hazardous driving behavior will not be tolerated.
