

# PROPOSED STREET LIGHTING DISTRICT ANNEXATION

**PETITION NO. 56-1017**

**ARROW HIGHWAY – LEAF AVENUE TO CITY OF AZUSA BOUNDARY**

**PROJECT NOTICE NO. 1**

Dear Property Owner:

On January 27, 2022, Public Works hosted a virtual community meeting for affected property owners via Zoom to provide an update on the street lighting request for Arrow Highway between Leaf Avenue and the City of Azusa boundary (see attached map). None of the property owners was able to attend. This Notice provides status on the request including the next steps. ## Petition Annexation Process

Property owners are responsible for the cost of street lighting. Prior to the COVID-19 Pandemic, Petition No. 56-1017 for the annexation of territory to the County Lighting Districts and installation of streetlights was circulated by a community member and was signed by property owners representing 66% (minimum 60%) of the area proposed for annexation.

There will be no costs to the property owners for the streetlight installation on existing wood power poles. However, base-rate assessment of \$5 per year for a single-family home will be included in the annual property tax bill to supplement the operation and maintenance costs of streetlights.

## Next Steps

If we don't hear from you by October 6, 2022, it means the majority of the property owners are in favor of street lighting. We will proceed with the legal process to annex your area to the County Lighting Districts, which can take up to 18 months to complete.

Concurrently we will prepare the layout design to install two streetlights on each of the four existing power poles located along the raised median that separates the frontage road adjacent to your property and Arrow Highway. The streetlights will illuminate the frontage road as well as Arrow Highway.
