Background

Waterworks District 29

- More than 7,500 connections
serving approximately 20,000 people
- 50 water storage tanks, 200 miles of pipelines
- 1 primary water supply source
- Infrastructure improvements needed

Background

- 2016 - Community outreach on infrastructure needs
- Nov. 2017 - Environmental Impact Report (EIR) initiated for priority improvements
- Oct. 2020 - Draft EIR available for review

Project Objective

- Provide a more reliable water system for existing Waterworks District 29 customers; and
- Complete the 9 most critical water system improvements that have been identified in Waterworks District 29 over the next 6 years.

Project Overview

- Two replacement water tanks
- Replace 34,300 feet of waterlines
- Construct 6,300-foot waterline for an emergency connection to Las Virgenes Water District
- Repair waterline segments at several creek crossings on PCH

Proposed Project

1. Carbon Canyon Road and Carbon Mesa Road Waterline Improvements
2. Coastline Drive 12-inch Waterline Improvements
3. District 29 Creek Crossing Repairs
4. Fernwood Tank Improvement
5. PCH 8-inch Waterline improvements
6. PCH & Topanga Beach Waterline Improvements
7. Emergency Source of Water Supply Connection
8. Big Rock Bypass Improvements
9. Upper Encinal Tank Improvement


